BIOS

Anne Gridley is a two time Obie award-winning actor, dramaturg, and artist. As a founding member of Nature Theater of Oklahoma, she has co-created and performed in critically acclaimed works including Life & Times, Poetics: A Ballet Brut, No Dice, Romeo & Juliet, and Burt Turrido. In addition to her work with Nature Theater, Gridley has performed with Jerôme Bel, Caborca, 7 Daughters of Eve, and Big Dance, served as a Dramaturg for the Wooster Group's production Who's Your Dada?, and taught devised theater at Bard College. Her drawings have been shown at H.A.U. Berlin, and Mass Live Arts. B.A. Bard College; M.F.A. Columbia University.

Bobbi Salvör Menuez is an actor & transdisciplinary artist, based in Lenapehoking (aka NYC).

Bria Bacon (she/her) is a 20-something, queer, performing artist. Although she is predominantly trained in movement art (dance), she holds passions and gifts in writing, sound-making, and theater. Bacon is currently occupying Munsee-Lenape lands in Brooklyn, as well as growing relationships abroad. She has worked with Sally Silvers Dance, Donna Uchizono Company, Kyle Marshall Choreography, Stephen Petronio Company, as well as Beth Gill and Rachel

Comey in NYFW. Her recent collaborations include Company Christoph Winkler, Johnnie Cruise Mercer, Matthew Lutz-Kinoy, and Reggie Wilson/Fist and Heel Performance Group. Bacon is originally from Munsee-Lenape lands in central New Jersey.

Cristina Latici was an OG dancer with chameckilerner, appearing in their first piece in 1993 and several subsequent pieces including hHomemade, The Butterfly Effect, Antonio Caido, and I Mutantes Seras, among others. Cristina began training parkour in 2017 at the age of 52. She coaches youth and adult parkour classes for The Movement Creative and is their Programming Director. Her parkour classes weave in the deep anatomical information that was cultivated through years of dancing with an emphasis on sustaining one's movement practice throughout one's life. Cristina also works as a special educator supporting young children who have learning differences. She has 3 amazing almost totally grown-up children.

Fabio Tavares is a Brazilian artist who's been forever obsessed with the human body in action. He started off as a competitive gymnast before running away to join the circus at the age of 15. Since moving to NYC in 1999, Mr. Tavares has collaborated and performed with Yvonne Meyer, Noemie Lafrance, Luis Lara Malvacías, Circus Amok, John Heginbotham, Laurie Anderson, Anna Kholer, Anne Bogart & SITI Company just to name a few. He danced with STREB for 14 years where he was the Associate Artistic Director for a decade. Mr. Tavares taught at Pace University and currently teaches at DGSD at Yale and The Juilliard School.

His one-man show based on Heiner Müller's Hamletmachine has been performed in Brazil, Europe and the U.S. since 2010. Fabio in certified in Alexander, Klein and Zero Balancing and couldn't be happier to be working with chameckilerner.

Jailyn Phillips-Wiley (she/her) is a Brooklyn based movement artist and a born n' bred product of New Jersey. Jailyn graduated from Mason Gross School of the Arts at Rutgers University in 2020, where she performed works by Shannon Gillen, Dawn Marie Bazemore, and Noa Zuk. In her senior year, she received the Majorie J. Turner award for outstanding choreography for her senior thesis. She also attended the Jerusalem Academy of Music and Dance. There she trained in gaga movement language, learned works from Batsheva Dance Company and Vertigo Dance

Company members, and performed work at the Suzanne Dellal Theater. Jailyn is a current member of Umoja Dance Company under the direction of Karen Love

Jody Oberfelder is a director, choreographer, and filmmaker, creating visceral experiences for audiences both onstage and in alternative sites. Her work has been shown internationally, most recently at Dance München Festival: two site specific works: Walking to Present at Olympiapark and Life Traveler. Her next piece, And Then, Now and will premiere May 4-6th, 2024. This live project is a collaboration between composer Isabel Crespo Pardo and their a capella trio Chatterbox, commissioned by Green-Wood Cemetery.. This work continues her investigations into aspects of body and life. Ted Johnson is a dancer, contacter and teacher living in Brooklyn, NY. Viviana Rodriguez is a dancer, fashion stylist, and structural integration practitioner. Born and raised in Argentina, she began studying dance at the National School of Dance and later became a member of The Taller de Danza Contemporánea del Teatro San Martin. During the late 1980s, Viviana moved to NYC on a scholarship from Jennifer Muller / The Works. She has performed with Ana Maria Stekelman, Renata Schussheim, Constanza Macras-Dorky Park, and Modosvivendi Cie among others. Viviana continues to explore the interconnected realms of movement and therapy. She is very excited to share the stage with these wonderful artists under the direction of chameckilerner.

Taylor Friel is a Brooklyn-based scenic designer originally from Las Vegas, Nevada. They design for dance, theatre, opera, and music videos. Their most

recent project was designing a site-reactive immersive production of A Midsummer Night's Dream in a Prospect Lefferts Gardens brownstone with Double Feature Plays. Paul Parreira is the founder and director of the NY-based record label, The Sound of Sinners—an avant-garde setting for artists who are jumping genres and mixing music styles, including Josephine Wiggs, Renegade Connection and Mighty Truth. His expertise as a musician and ambient music historian has led to projects with writers, artists, musicians and dancers throughout his career. He is proud of the previous collaborations with chameckilerner on Hidden Form (2001), Visible Content (2003) and I Mutantes Seras (1999). His forthcoming EP will be released in 2024.

Chamecki and **Andrea Lerner**, an interdisciplinary duo working in the intersection of dance and timebased media. Chamecki and Lerner are both natives of Curitiba, Brazil, and together they moved to New York in 1989. Their first piece, Jackie & Judy, premiered at The Bessie Schoenberg Dance Theater in 1993. They have been working together ever since.

They are the recipient of various fellowships and grants for their multidisciplinary work, including the Guggenheim Fellowship, The Foundation for Contemporary Arts, NYFA Fellowship, NYSCA, NEFA, Jerome Foundation, Rockefeller MAP Fund, SIEMENS, ALTRIA, Greenwall Foundation, among others.

chameckilerner work has been presented in the US by The Kitchen, DTW, The Joyce Theater, Performance Space 122, Central Park SummerStage, Portland Institute for Contemporary Art, Mass MoCA, Diverseworks, Jacob's Pillow, American Dance Festival, among others. In addition, their work toured extensively in both South America and Europe.

In 2007, they premiered EXIT at The Kitchen in

New York, where they investigate the possibility of extinction and reinvention. The reinvention marked the beginning of chameckilerner's interest in video and installation. This new body of work was featured in group shows, including The Contemporary Art Festival Sesc-VideoBrasil, Tupi or Not Tupi at Museum Oscar Niemeyer in Brazil, BLUEPRINT at MOCA Tucson, Boca Raton Museum of the Arts in Florida, Wexner Center for The Arts in Ohio, San Francisco Museum of Modern Art, SOFT POWER-Arte Brasil at Kunsthal KAdE in The Netherland, INVISIBLE DOG in New York to name a few. ESKAZISER, chameckilerner four-channel installation, was presented at THE BOILER- PIEROGI GALLERY, NY, in 2018.

chameckilerner was a resident at Robert Wilson's Watermill Center, at EMPAC (Curtis R. Priem ExperimentalMedia and Performing Arts Center at Rensselaer), and the YADDO Foundation, a 2019 Artist in Residence at the ROBERT RAUSCHENBERG Foundation and a Gibney DIP Residency Artist, and they received the Fall 2020 Fellowships at The Bogliasco Foundation In Italy.

We achieve all of this by creating a vessel for artistic experimentation through a residency package serving the whole artist - salary, space, responsive and flexible support for the development of new work from inspiration to presentation.
